



ACADEMICS ARE OFTEN THE MOST SUBSTANTIAL CHALLENGE FACED BY INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- Overseas schools may have different expectations for homework, workload, deadlines, citations, and more
- Language issues may hurt their ability to understand things
- This may also hinder their ability to learn from instructors and collaborate with peers



LIVING IN A NEW COUNTRY CAN BE AN ISOLATING EXPERIENCE



- Homesickness, isolation, and loneliness can be common problems faced by international students
- Language problems can exacerbate isolation
- When looking for employment, vastly different cultural norms can make it harder to secure interviews or a job offer




